Abstract: The materials in the collection document different aspects of the Association for Women Students as well as other women involvement on campus from 1949 to 2013. The content includes constitutions, handbooks, sponsored events, meeting minutes etc. In addition, there is also information about women housing, the Women Resource Center, and the Women's Studies program over the years at SU.

History: The Association of Women students, also known as AWS, was founded in November of 1967. The Dean of Freshmen, Dorothy Anderson, had worked with a chapter of AWS while she was in graduate school, and encouraged Susquehanna University to have one as well. The women who started it wanted the organization to involve all women on campus, which led to the collection of dues from every woman student on campus. AWS was committed to the liberation of women.

AWS was very interested in sponsoring educational programs for women. They also sponsored a Big Sister/Little Sister pairing in order to get new freshmen women acquainted with campus. In March of 1971, the SU chapter joined the International AWS and began to participate in their large conventions. Eventually, SU women began to occupy positions in the Intercollegiate AWS.

AWS also was highly involved with women housing on campus and helping to alter the rules and regulations for women. When women were first admitted to the, then called, Missionary Institute, the school believed in 'in loco parentis,' which means

that the school would function as a parent to women living on campus. This led to the enforcement of strict curfews, rules about men and women interacting, and even the enactment of permission needed for women to spend the night in a friend's dorm. When AWS was formed, it worked to change these rules and give women more freedom on campus.

AWS died out in the 1980s. It slowly faded along with the Intercollegiate AWS. SU's chapter of AWS had reached its goals and there was no pressing need for it to be on campus anymore. These goals included items such as easing parietals, providing information and resources on birth control, and highlighting institutional issues affecting women. They really paved the way for women to feel at ease at SU.

In addition to AWS, the Women's Resource Center came into existence and worked to help women on campus. They created a newsletter called "Page of Our Own" that was published on campus. Also, the Women's Studies Working Group was gathered to help with the development of a new program in women's studies in 1988. A women studies minor was created from weekly meetings with the Women's Studies Working Group.

Scope Content:

The artifacts date back to a large span of time from 1949 to 2013. They include constitutions, handbooks, and sponsored programs from AWS, amongst other things. The items mainly are from AWS, but some documents are from other women organizations on campus.

At present, eight series have been identified within this collection. They are: I. AWS Affairs II. AWS Handbook Series. III. AWS Sponsored Events IV. Intercollegiate AWS V. Miscellaneous VI. Women Housing VII. Women Resource Center VIII. Women Studies

Series I. AWS Affairs- This series relates to the official side of AWS and has items like constitutions as well as information about dues, elections, and the general assembly.

Series II. AWS Handbooks- This series contains handbooks produced by AWS about their organization.

Series III. AWS Sponsored Events- This series has paperwork in it relating to events sponsored by AWS. For instance, it has AWS's Babysitting and Big-Little Sister programs. There is also information about AWS's involvement with the Homecoming and May Day Courts. Furthermore, there are many invitations to various events within this series.

Series IV. Intercollegiate AWS- This series holds information about the national AWS organization that SU's on campus AWS group was a part of.

Series V. Miscellaneous- This series contains a vast array of artifacts relating to SU women and campus life. There are newspaper articles, sheet music, employment information for women graduates, and letter addressed to the Dean of Women. In

addition, there is a large File Folder with information about an event that SU hosted called Women, the Arts, and Society. It was held in 1988 and there is a lot of paperwork documenting the event.

Series VI. Women Housing- This series has documentation of women housing and how it changed over the years at SU.

Series VII. Women Resource Center- This series consists of different flyers and newsletters put out by the Women Resource Center.

Series VIII. Women Studies- This series contains information about the Women Studies program in regards to the major and minor. There also is information about the Women's Studies Work Group program.

Organization: This collection is organized alphabetically in chronological order.
